FACILITATION FOR PHARMACEUTICAL EXPORTS SUBSIDY ON MEDICAL REPRESENTATIVE SALARY

In the new Trade Policy for the year 2009-10, Government of Pakistan has announced the continuation of Medical representative subsidy to the pharmaceutical companies for hiring medical representatives to promote their brands in foreign markets. This Scheme is meant to offer marketing support only to the pharmaceutical exporters of allopathic drugs in shape of financial support to place medical representatives in designated export markets. This Public Notice would also cover cases of medical representative with TDAP of all those companies who have already applied for subsidy claim.

2. Short Title and Commencement:

This scheme to be called "Facilitating Export of Pharmaceutical Products" will come into operation with immediate effect. In terms of Current Trade Policy, export enterprises selected for financial assistance under this scheme, will be provided subsidy to 3- medical representative in each country for a period of 2-years @ US\$ 500/- per medical representative per month. For designated high cost countries, this support will be double i.e. US\$ 1,000.

3. Eligibility & Conditions:

- i. All manufactures and exporters having their products registered abroad will be eligible.
- ii. A maximum of 3 medical representatives per country to be authorized who will act as representatives of companies whose products are registered abroad only in the countries / markets proposed by TDAP.
- iii. Medical representatives so appointed must be science graduate, with at least 2-years experience with reputable pharma firms, however, relaxation will be given in some countries on the criteria of qualification.
- iv. Cases will be processed upon proof of submission of registration of Company / products abroad.
- v. Period of appointment will be two years and will commence from date of issuance of approval letter from TDAP (copy of contract would be required).
- vi. Payment will be made in Pakistani rupee at the prevalent US\$ rate.
- vii. Proof of medical representatives stay in the foreign country would be required in form of an affidavit by the exporting company as well as by the distributor / importer in the foreign country that medical representative is working under the payroll of Pakistani company and working for every quarter.
- viii. Firms using the facility would be required to furnish monthly progress report about promotional activities of medical representatives for non-OTC products as well as export documentation such as Custom Invoice, duly endorsed Bill of Lading / Airway Bill, along with the monthly statement clearing showing the exports against the previous month.

All those companies who had earlier obtained approval from TDAP for hiring medical reps in foreign countries and the approval was expired on June 2009 need not to apply. However, they may apply for any new foreign market subject to the approval of case for medical representative hiring by the TDAP.

4. Procedure:

Interested pharmaceutical exporting companies may apply to the Trade Development Authority of Pakistan with following particulars:

- i) Profile of the local firm as well as distributor / importer abroad.
 - ii) Name of the product registered along with the name of the country
 - iii) Export Performance
 - iv) Particulars of the medical representatives which company intends to hire.
5. All applications supported by relevant documents, be sent to Trade Development Authority of Pakistan, 3rd floor, Finance & Trade Centre, Shara-e-Faisal, Karachi, prior to the appointment of the medical representatives abroad.

Based on the credentials of applicant, Trade Development Authority of Pakistan will select the exporting establishment for this facility and will also approve the names of the medical representatives.

6. Disbursement:

Payment will be disbursed on quarterly basis.

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PUBLIC NOTICE

50% SUBSIDY ON PHARMACEUTICAL PRODUCT REGISTRATION IN FOREIGN COUNTRIES

The Trade Policy 2009-10 envisages that a 50% subsidy would be allowed to pharmaceutical companies for registration of their products in foreign countries. This Public Notice would also cover the cases of registration with TDAP of all those companies who have already applied for subsidy claim.

Short Title and Commencement:

This scheme to be called "Facilitating Export of Pharmaceutical Products" will come into operation immediately. It would apply to the registration obtained by the pharmaceutical companies from the 1st July, 2009 to 30th June, 2010 in foreign countries for the purpose of exports. This public notice would also cover the processing of cases which are already submitted by the pharmaceutical exporters with TDAP earlier. The scheme provides 50% subsidy to national pharmaceutical companies only in respect of fee paid by them to the concerned authorities in the foreign countries.

Eligibility Criteria

Following will be the eligibility criteria:

- i. Manufactures/exporters
- ii. Commercial exporters, provided they are authorized by the original manufacturers, in writing to seek registration of the products.
- iii. The allopathic / herbal types / categories of drugs, medicines, medicaments, pharmaceuticals and medical products will be eligible for the subsidy.
- iv. The subsidy will cover only the initial registration fee and not subsequent fees for renewal if required.

Procedure:

The subsidy will be paid to the pharmaceutical exporting companies that have obtained regularizations of their products in the importing countries and on submission of the following documents to the TDAP.

- i. Registration certificate (original and photocopy) Original certificate will be returned after being seen and attested by the concerned product officer of TDAP or at the level of Director or above.
- ii. Original and photocopy of receipt of the payment made in the importing country where product is registered. Original receipt will be returned after being seen and attested by the concerned product officer of TDAP or at the level of Director or above.
- iii. If the Drug Registration Certificate and / or Payment Receipt are in a language other than English, the translation of Drug registration certificate / payment receipt in English duly endorsed by the PPMA will have to be submitted to TDAP.
- iv. Drug Registration Certificate/Payment Receipt must be issued by the regulatory Authority in favor of exporting firm in the concerned foreign country.

SUPPORT ON EXPORT OF PROCESSED FOOD

Raw and semi-processed agricultural products being currently exported from Pakistan can get higher returns if exported as processed food. However, Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT) on processed food require compliance to more sophisticated standards and thereby higher cost of production. Government in the Trade Policy for the year 2009-10 has decided to support initiating the export of processed food by reimbursing R&D cost @ 6% of the exports. After detailed study / analysis the quantum and mode of support would be adjusted in May 2010.

Terms & Conditions

- i. The exporters would submit their claims to TDAP through their banks at the address given below.
- ii. In case of advance payment, the exporters would be required to submit the claim within 30 days otherwise the duration for filing the claims would be 90 days from the date of realization of export Sales proceed.
- iii. Exporters would to submit the following documents alongwith their claims:
 - ◆ Form E
 - ◆ GD
 - ◆ Customs verified Invoice – original
 - ◆ Bank certificate / Undertaking
 - ◆ Export Proceed Realization certificate
- iv. Reimbursement would be made on Remittances instead of Actual Exports.
- v. Exporters would be required to submit the export performance certificate duly verified by the bank(s).
- vi. All shipments of Processed Food from 1st August, 2009 will qualify for the facility.
- vii. List of the H.S. Codes eligible for assistance under this scheme may be downloaded from TDAP's website.
- viii. All the payments would be made through State Bank of Pakistan after the scrutiny of the claims by a Scrutiny Committee constituted by TDAP for this purpose.

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PUBLIC NOTICE WAREHOUSING SCHEME

To make inroads into non-traditional markets and / or to introduce non-traditional products in traditional markets a warehouse scheme was launched and a warehouse was established in Kenya. The changing patterns of trade require direct to store deliveries and thereby need of warehouse even in traditional markets.

Keeping in view the changing pattern of trade that require direct-to-store deliveries, Government has decided to continue the warehousing scheme in Trade Policy 2009-10 and its scope has been expanded to include traditional markets and traditional products. also

Eligible Countries

The scheme will be open for all the countries and the exporter(s) would be allowed to establish a warehouse in any part of the world provided that is a potential market for Pakistani products.

Terms & Conditions

- Exporter (s) would identify the city / country where they need to have the warehouse.
- Individual exporters or consortium of exporters and / or export house can apply for this facility.
- Any exportable product / exporter would be eligible for the said facility.
- Exporter (s) would be required to follow the local laws of the country where the warehouse would be exported.
- Eligible exporters would enter into an agreement with TDAP
- Funding by Government would be involved as per following criteria:

For 1st year

1st Quarter	100%
2nd Quarter	75%
3rd Quarter	50%
4th Quarter	25%

- After one year, the exporter(s) would bear all the cost.
- In case the exporter fails to progress and maintain the warehouse, TDAP would invoke penalty clause written in agreement claiming the Government amount spent on establishment of warehouse along with interest.

Business Procedure for Opening Retail Sales Outlets Abroad

- The outlets to be opened/established, invariably, shall be in the sole ownership of the said firm/company.
- The firm/company will submit an undertaking on stamped/Judicial paper, of Rs.100/- denomination, to the effect that their export performance is in the same product(s)/item(s) for which they have applied to TDAP to avail the facility.
- The firm/company will submit with their claim the copy of the rental contract of sales outlet, duly attested by the Pakistani Mission/Commercial Section/Consulate in the respective country of location.
- Pakistani Mission/Commercial Section/Consulate, henceforth, would only attest the documents (rental agreement & employee contracts).
- Verification of the retail sales outlets would be carried out through third party (Law Firm / Chartered Accountant) through an inbuilt mechanism.
- The selected exporter would be required to follow the Law of Land of the country where they intend to open the outlet.
- The amount will be reimbursed on quarterly basis.
- In case it is found out at any stage that the selected firm/company has resorted to mis-declaration to claim the financial assistance, TDAP will cancel the selection and withdraw the facility extended to the firm/company. In such an event TDAP shall not only proceed against the exporter for the mis-declaration, as per prescribed rules, but they shall also be liable to return/ reimburse the amount already paid to them in this behalf.

This is also applicable to the Exporters who have already applied against the subject scheme.



PUBLIC NOTICE ASSISTANCE FOR OPENING RETAIL SALES OUTLETS ABROAD

To promote Pakistan's export brands abroad and introduce retail operations in export markets, Trade Policy 2005-06 provided sharing of rental costs of outlets, established in potential export markets by exporters. This Scheme continued during the Trade Policy 2007-08 also under this initiative the Government is providing support to the extent of 75%, 50%, 25% and 10% of the rental cost of the retail outlet in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th years respectively, with suitable cases on case to case basis. It has been decided to continue this initiative in the Trade Policy 2009-10.

Eligibility Conditions:

- Companies / Exporters either having exports in excess of US \$ 1 million in the last year or running at least 3 outlets in major cities of Pakistan.
- The outlets must be established exclusively by one company. Joining of 2 or more companies / exporters will not be admissible.
- At least 50% of the products at the outlets should be of Pakistani origin. Outlets can be opened in any country / city of the world which is known to be a market for the product concerned.
- The financial support will be available only for space rentals and will not cover utilities, overheads or any other expenses.

Applications are invited from companies / exporters interested in availing financial assistance under this scheme, alongwith the following information / documents:

- Applicant firm selects an accredited certification agency for the relevant certification program, finalizes terms and conditions with it and submit application to TDAP.
- Evaluation and acceptance of the request by TDAP
- Completion of certification requirements by the applicant firm leading to award of certificate by the certification agency.
- Submission of the certificate along with agreement signed with certification body and payment receipts to TDAP for release of payment.
- For certifications where surveillance Audit is required, 50% payment will be released upon attainment of certificate and balance 50% will be paid upon production of satisfactory surveillance Audit Report.

TRADE POLICY 2009-10

Business Procedure for Opening of Export Offices Abroad

- a. The office to be opened/established, invariably, should be in the name and style of the same firm/company for which they apply to TDAP for the subject facility and it (the abroad office) shall also be in the sole ownership of the said firm/company.
- b. Employees hired for the abroad office may be of Pakistani or Non-Pakistani origin.
- c. The firm/company will submit an undertaking on stamped/Judicial paper of Rs.100/- denomination, to the effect that their export performance is in the same product(s)/item(s) for which they have applied to TDAP to avail the facility.
- d. The firm/company will submit with their claim (for 50% of the rental and 50% of the salary), the copies of the contract of office rental and the contract with the employees hired, duly attested by the Pakistani Mission/Commercial Section/Consulate in the respective country of location.
- e. TDAP, at any stage, would monitor/check the performance of abroad offices through third party verification.
- f. The selected company (ies) would be required to follow the Law of Land of the country where they intend to open their office(s) and all other unnecessary documentation would be avoided.
- g. The amount will be reimbursed on quarterly basis.
- h. TDAP has fixed capping for the rentals and salaries for each city/ country and reimbursement will be made either on the basis of 50% of TDAP capping or 50% of the actual amount, whichever is lower.
- i. Exporters will be required to submit a performance report of their abroad office on monthly basis.
- j. In case it is found out at any stage that the selected firm/company has resorted to mis-declaration to claim the 50% rental and 50% salary, TDAP will cancel the selection and withdraw the facility extended to the firm/company. In such an event TDAP shall not only proceed against the exporter for the mis-declaration, as per prescribed rules, but they shall also be liable to return/reimburse the amount already paid to them in this behalf.

This is also applicable to the exporters who have already applied against the subject scheme.



PUBLIC NOTICE ASSISTANCE FOR OPENING EXPORTERS OFFICES ABROAD

Government of Pakistan had announced in Trade Policy 2007-08 to provide assistance to socially and environmentally compliant and ISO Certified companies for setting up business offices abroad. It has been decided to continue this scheme during the Trade Policy 2009-10. Under this initiative following incentives will be provided with appropriate caps on the upper limit.

- a. 50 % subsidy in rentals for three years.
- b. 50 % subsidy in salaries for three employees for three years.

Eligible countries

Malaysia, Japan, China, UAE, Russia, USA, EU and Africa.

INSTALLATION OF FLAYING MACHINES IN ABATOIRS/SLAUGHTERHOUSES OPERATED BY LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

For the improvement of supply chain of Leather Sector exports, there is an imminent need to introduce flaying machines in abattoirs operated by local governments as minimum of 25% hides and skins are estimated to be rendered useless from butcher cuts. In order to encourage the installation and use of flaying machines, Trade Policy 2009-10 envisages matching grants for installing the flaying machines in abattoirs/slaughterhouses operated by City/District/Tehsil/Town governments.

All local governments (City/District/Tehsil/Town) operating abattoirs/slaughterhouses are invited to send business proposal/working paper for the installation of flaying machines to TDAP latest by 31st October, 2009 at the following address:

ESTABLISHMENT OF COLD STORAGE AND COOL CHAIN PROCESSES FOR HORTICULTURE PRODUCTS

Establishment of cold storage/cool chain infrastructure is necessary to control post harvest losses and to preserve quality in fruits, vegetable and flowers. For this purpose, Government of Pakistan, in the Trade Policy 2009-10, has provided an incentive to horticulture exporter by allowing mark-up subsidy @ 8% or 50% whichever is lower on loans obtained for establishment of above process. This scheme, to be called "Establishment of Cold Storage and Cool Chain Processes for Horticulture Products" will come into operation with immediate effect. Horticulture exporters selected for support under this scheme will be allowed the following incentive:

"Mark-up subsidy on loans @8% or 50% which ever is lower obtained by Horticulture exporters for establishment of Cold Storage and Cool Chain Processes will be picked-up by the Trade Development Authority of Pakistan.

3. Eligibility Criteria:

- The loan has been obtained on market rates and does not have any element of subsidy whatsoever.
- Tenor of the loan is not in excess of 7.5 years including grace period.

4. Procedure:

Horticulture exporters who desire to avail support under this scheme are advised to get prior approval from TDAP before disbursement of loan. Payment of mark-up to eligible enterprises will be made by TDAP on reimbursement basis only. All applications should be supported by loan documents, project profile and a certificate from the financing bank confirming terms of the loan and receipt of mark-up. In case of default by the enterprise in repayment of bank loan, TDAP subsidy on mark-up will be terminated immediately.

- In case of advance payment, the exporters would be required to submit the claim within 30 days otherwise the duration for filing the claims would be 90 days from the date of realization of export sales proceed.
- Exporters would submit the following documents alongwith their claims:

 - ◆ Copy of Health Certificate issued by Marine Fisheries Department, Government of Pakistan.
- Reimbursement would be made on Remittances instead of Actual Exports.
- All by air shipments of Live Seafood from 1st September, 2009 will qualify for the facility.
- Payments would be made through National Bank of Pakistan, FIC branch, Karachi after the scrutiny of the claims by a Scrutiny Committee constituted by TDAP for this purpose.
