The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) in its meeting held on 20-07-2010 has inter alia decided that;

"Within a period of six months, the National Tariff Commission will give recommendations whether deemed import drawbacks are warranted on account of losses suffered by industry due to escalation in cost of doing business due to security situation".

All stakeholders are requested to please furnish the requisite data in the enclosed form as soon as possible but not later then two weeks of the issue of this letter for timely completion of the report.
