Subject: <u>Implementation of UN Security Council Sanction Resolutions</u>

- 1. The Panel of Experts (PoE), established pursuant to UNSCR-1874 (2009) on DPRK, annually submits report to UNSC-1718 Committee. The March 2017 report notes that DPRK has intensified its prohibited activities consecquently UNSC adopted Resolution-2270 (S.R.O 403(I)/2016) and Resolution 2321 (S.R.O 77(I)/2017), which significantly strengthen the sanction regime against DPRK. Additional measures impose new obligations on member States and require the requisite political will, prioritization and resource allocation to ensure effective implementation.
- 2. All relevant authorities are advised to exercise heightened vigilance including over diplomatic agents of DPRK, suspected of involvement in commercial activites, particularly in prohibitied items.
- 3. Recommendations of the PoE to member States (PoE complete report S/2017/150 is available at https://www.un.org) are enclosed (Annex-I) for perusal and undertaking necessary measures as deemed appropriate and mandated under S.R.O's issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Recommendations of the Panel to Member States

- Member States should exercise heightened vigilance over diplomatic agents of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea who are engaging in professional or commercial activities, particularly prohibited items
- Member States should annul any contract with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea or its nationals concerning the direct or indirect supply or transfer of statues, or services related to the maintainence of statues.
- Flag and port States should verify the origin and legal validity of insurance of Democratic People's Republic of Korea-flagged vessel or vessels suspected of being crewed by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.
- Member States should communicate to the Committee available information on designated entities or entities owned or controlled by individuals acting on behalf of or at the direction of designated entities or individuals, or those which have assisted in the evasion of sanctions or violation of the resolutions.
- Member States should exercise enhanced vigilance over their companies participating
 in the Pyongyang International Trade Fair and alert them that any form of engagement
 with designated entities or those undertaking prohibited activities is a violation of the
 resolutions.
- Given the continuing activites by the designated banks and their representatives, the Panel recalls Member States' obligation to freeze all assets controlled by them and those acting on their behalf, and to report such actions to the Committee and to share relevant information with the panel.
- When Member States freeze bulk cash or gold smuggled by nationals of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, they should immediately inform the Committee and ensure this they cannot be used for prohibited activities or evasion of sanctions before releasing them.
