

#### PAKISTAN HOSIERY MANUFACTURERS & EXPORTERS ASSOCIATION

PROFILE: Pakistan Hosiery Manufacturers & Exporter Association is the premier trade organization representing the hosiery and knitwear industry of Pakistan, accelerating and providing growth in all sectors of the economy, generating immense employment and promoting national self-reliance.

FOUNDING: Its history dates back to the year 1960 when Pakistan Hosiery Manufacturers Association (PHMA) was established by a few dedicated industrialists and leading manufacturers of hosiery and knitwear in Karachi. PHMA was registered with the ministry of commerce under section 26 of the companies act 1913 on the 7th day of July 1960 and incorporated under the Companies Act 1913 on the 31st day of August 1960.

OBJECTIVE: "to promote, develop, protect, stimulate and encourage the hosiery, knitwear and all made-ups, fabrics, home textile products of cotton, wool, silk or man-made fibers and to raise the standard of their production and enhance exports" among other aims & objects.

SETTING UP OF NORTH ZONE: Shortly thereafter North Zone Office was opened in Lahore followed by offices in Faisalabad and Sialkot to facilitate the members there and to provide prompt and better services to the members and exporters of Faisalabad, Sialkot and Multan.

INDUSTRY SIZE: The hosiery and knitwear industrial network of Pakistan comprises 3,500 large, medium and small units, 85% of which are small enterprises, 10% medium ventures and only 5% large integrated factories. The industry provides jobs to 700,000 people in an environment dominated by redundancies and downsizing in giant multinationals, foreign banks and big corporations.

SHARE IN EMPLOYMENT: The industry sustains directly, livelihood of 210,000 skilled workers and their families; 490,000 unskilled workers and their kith & kin. Another 350,000 people benefit in allied cottage industries. Thus the industry provides directly and indirectly sustenance to well over a million people.

INVESTMENT IN KNITWEAR SECTOR: Despite being a labour-intensive industry, the investment in the knitwear and hosiery units is estimated at Rupees Seven billion (PKR 7 billion) and tops the list of industries for value added exports ranking as the second largest foreign exchange earner in the country.

PRODUCT LINE: Knitwear exports consist of knitted and processed fabrics knitted garments which include: Shirts / T-Shirts, Hooded Jackets / blazers, Trouser, Bed Sheets, Fabrics, Socks & other garments.

SHARE IN TEXTILE EXPORTS: It is a pride to mention here that all the exports of all the above knitted products is 35% of the nation's exports. The knitwear industry consequently emerges as the country's top foreign exchange earner.

TODAY AND THE FUTURE: It is a labour intensive industry in a capital scarce and labour-surplus economy. Its role in broad basing prosperity, alleviating poverty and in making domestic market prosperous is matched by very few industries. It is an established fact that today, knitwear and hosiery products have the largest consumption. Observe any sports event and one will find millions and millions of people young and old, male and female, all wearing knitted products. Large multinationals, all over the world advertise their products with their messages printed on T-shirts. Today there are many countries where people live below the poverty line and spend first for food, shelter and then garments. Knitted garments are definitely cheaper than woven ones, easy to wash and trendy, being used all over the world. The overall global production and consumption of knitted garments is much higher than that of woven garments. It is also forecast that in future knit shirt will replace woven shirt and will be in great demand always.

# PHMA Central Chairman Review (Oct-2020 to Sep-2021)

The Pakistan Hosiery Manufacturers & Exporters Association's is the premier Association of Value-added Textile Sector, established in 1960. The PHMA elected Chairman & Office Bearers shoulder the responsibility to promote, develop, stimulate and protect the Pakistan's textile industry's interest in general and enhancement of exports particular. PHMA's Chairman is also meticulous to deliberate upon all questions connected with textile industry and its exporters and to initiate and support necessary action connected therewith; and to consider, support or oppose legislative or other government measures affecting the interests of value-added textile industry and also make representations to the Government on grievances if any. The PHMA, among all other Textile Association, always takes the lead and represent on the forefront at all forums throughout the year.

To elect as the Central Chairman of PHMA is indeed an honour and privilege. My colleagues reposed confidence in me to lead the Association in these most challenging times in the history of Pakistan when the industry has been facing highest ever cost of manufacturing and cutthroat competition with regional competitors.

- > Zoom Meeting of Ministry of Commerce with Textile Associations to discuss New Textile Policy 2020 held on 5th Oct 2021.
- Omar Ayub Khan, Federal Minister for Energy (Petroleum & Power) visited PHMA House, Karachi 9th October, 2020 along with Nadeem Babar, Special Assistant to Prime Minister (SAPM) on Petroleum, Mian Asad Hayaud Din Federal Secretary for Energy and top management of SSGCL for meeting with Chairmen Textile Associations to discuss the gas crisis in winter. Government Officials assured that implementation of reduced gas tariff without FBR certificate, new gas pipeline in the SITE Industrial Area, instant process of RLNG applications, regularization of extra gas load, removal of ring on gas meters, new tariff of zero rated consumers in winter season for smooth gas supply.
- Meeting with Advisor to PM on Commerce & Textile, Mr. Abdul Razak Dawood held on 21-10-20 at Islamabad to discuss skyrocketing prices of Cotton Yarn, Unavailability of Yarn, dollar depreciation against local currency, Outstanding payments of pending Custom Rebate Claims, Income Tax Claims, Sales Tax Refund Claims, DLTL / DDT & TUF Schemes and non-compliance of reduced tariff of electricity and gas for five zero rated industries.
- > Zoom Meeting held with Advisor to PM on Commerce Mr. Razak Dawood on 26 Oct 2020 to address the recent crisis of cotton yarn being faced by the Value Added Textile Industry. PHMA submitted its short term and long term proposals.
- Zoom Meeting with Mr. Muhammad Sualeh Ahmed Farooqui, Federal Secretary, Ministry of Commerce held on 15th December, 2020 wherein Mr. Kanwar Usman, Director General (Textile), Ministry of Commerce also present whereby issues of Anti-Dumping Duty levied on imports that are to be used as inputs in products destined solely for exports, Non-Compliance of reduced tariff of electricity and gas for five zero rated industries by utilities companies, RLNG at the rate of \$6.5 per MMBTU not provided to Exporters of Karachi, Outstanding payments of DLTL / DDT Claims & TUF Schemes, continuous decline in Cotton Crop leading to shortage of cotton yarn which is basic raw material for value added garment and home textile sectors and custom duty on import of cotton yarn. Secretary Commerce replied that all the demands of PHMA is valid and shall be taken positively at the appropriate time with all concerned.
- Meeting of Ministry of Commerce with Textile Associations on shortage of cotton yarn held on 9 Feb 2021 chaired by Advisor to PM on Commerce.
- > Zoom meeting of Ministry of Commerce with value added textile sector on Post Budget held on 16 June 2021.



- > Zoom meeting of Ministry of Commerce with Chairmen, Textile Associations chaired by Adviser to Prime Minister on Commerce Razak Dawood held on 6th April, 2021. Chairmen, Textile Association demanded that Government must immediately place ban on export of cotton yarn from Pakistan or impose 10% duty on export of cotton yarn from Pakistan and allow duty free import of cotton yarn from countries worldwide for at least next six months to control the aggravating crisis of cotton varn which is not available to the Value Added Textile Export Sector of Pakistan as such the cotton yarn crisis is resulting to declining trend in exports. Responding to the demands and suggestions of Textile Exporters, Adviser to Prime Minister on Commerce Razak Dawood stated that he has always supported the textile export sector and he shall continue to support and facilitate and the Ministry will take all decision in complete consultation by taking on board all the stakeholder Associations. He noted the suggestions and demands of textile exporters to allow duty free import of cotton yarn, to place ban on export of cotton yarn or impose 10% duty on export of cotton yarn. He assured that the Commerce Ministry has taken serious notice of the situation and will revert back in next few days.
- Meeting of PHMA Delegation with Mr. Muhammad Sualeh Ahmed Farooqui, Federal Secretary, Ministry of Commerce held on 24th September, 2021 at 12:30 pm in NICL Office, Karachi. Discussed the problems in shipments of export containers as the vessels are reluctant load containers from Pakistan due to lesser charges as compared to other countries in the region and vessel taking empty containers from Pakistan, enhancement of bilateral trade through Regional Connectivity with EU countries by opening trade via land routes, concessional Rates of RLNG \$6.5 per MMBTU for Export Oriented Sectors of Karachi (Sindh), availability of Gas in winter season to Export Oriented Sectors, Excessive delays in announcement of Textile Policy 2020-25 and DDT / DLTL Notification, Cotton Crop and Availability of Cotton Yarn for textile exporters.

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- The Second Meeting of the FBR Technical Committee for discussions on new refund system FASTER and Annexure H and proposals to streamline the FASTER system led by Mr. Jawed Bilwani, Member Committee held on Thursday 01 October 2020. From FBR, the Chief Sales Tax and his team were participated.
- > The Third Meeting of the FBR Technical Committee on taxation issues held on 09 October 2020.
- The Fourth Meeting of the FBR Technical Committee on taxation issues held on 16 October 2020.
- The Sixth Meeting of the FBR Technical Committee on taxation issues held on 29 October 2020 to discuss simplification of tax procedures.

The meeting appreciated smooth functioning of FASTER Plus and disbursement of claims within 48-72 hours recognizing that the system was performing towards maximum efficiency. However, it was discussed that more than 80% textile exporters were getting the refunds after recent upgrading of FASTER to FASTER plus in specified timeline, whereas, the grievances of remaining 20% approx. needs to be addressed. Outstanding payments of pending Custom Rebate Claims, Income Tax Claims, DLTL / DDT & TUF Schemes and Sales Tax Refund Claims, Audit Notices of Sales Tax and Income Tax were also discussed.

- Sindh Industrial Liaison Committee Meeting was held under the Chair of Governor Sindh, Imran Ismail on Energy issues confronting to the industries of Sindh on 29th January, 2021 at Sindh Governor House, Karachi. Special Assistant to Prime Minister on Petroleum, Nadeem Babar and Special Assistant to Prime Minister on Power, Tabish Gohar were also present in the meeting. Mr. Muhammad Zubair Motiwala Chairman BMG and Former President KCCI and Muhammad Jawed Bilwani Chief Coordinator Karachi Industrial Forum represented industries of Sindh. The Governor Sindh said that industrial development is one of the top priorities of Prime Minister Imran Khan. He said that the federal government would extend all possible assistance to them for industrial growth and of country's exports. He committed that no industry would be disconnected from gas supply unless they have an electricity connection to meet their requirements.

- ➤ Joint Press Conference of value-added textile sectors held at PHMA House Karachi on 2nd March, 2021 on the shortage of cotton yarn. Chairman of Council of Textile Associations Muhammad Zubair Motiwala, and Chief Coordinator of the council and Chairman of Pakistan Apparel Forum Muhammad Jawed Bilwani said despite COVID-19 pandemic big export orders from different countries were coming to Pakistan for various value-



added textile products but short supply of cotton yarn in the local market hindered their production activities and rendered many textile manufacturers unable to meet their export orders. Chairmen value-added textile associations unanimously urged that the government should immediately allow duty-free import of cotton-yarn and impose ban on cotton yarn export like it did in the cases of wheat and sugar shortage in the country.






